- (ii) Fellowship His love for the fellowship at Southern Cross E.C was plain for all to see. He knew most by name and was a friend to all. In a wider sense his home was an open door to many of the Lord's servants over the years and he will be remembered with deep affection.
- (iii) Future He quoted many texts in his public prayers and one which was often mentioned was 1 John

3-2... "What manner of love the Father has bestowed upon us that we should be called the sons of God" and then he would add his own bit - and WONDER OF WONDERS .. "we shall be like Him." The reality of that wonder is his for ever in fullest measure.

I have written at length about our late brother not only because I greatly miss the support and encouragement I received from him so constantly, but because as a church, we should ever remember the debt we owe to him and others like him. The best way we can repay it, is by seeking to be more faithful to the Lord who gives us such men and women and more zealous in our own daily service for Him.
