Roddam Burn — Harriet Gardner — Sworn by the said George Roddam Burn and Harriet Gardner Spinster at St: 5 Saint Ann's Terrace Brixton Road in the County of Surrey this twelfth day of March 1862 before me — Adam Burn a London Commissioner to administer Oaths in Chancery.

On the 19<sup>th</sup> March 1862 Oath was taken with the will annexed of the personal estate and effects of William Willis formerly of St: 20 Easter Place Lambeth in the County of Surrey but late of St: 5 Saint Ann's Terrace Brixton Road in the same County Esquire who died 23<sup>rd</sup> of February 1862 at St: 5 Saint Ann's Terrace aforesaid was granted to Sarah Edwards Willis widow the Relict and the several legatees named in the said will, the having been first sworn also Executor being named in the said will.
